

GenUrb is a six-year international research project, funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC, Canada), that brings together over 40 feminists, academics, policy makers, and activists to advance our understanding of how the relationship between poverty and inequality is being transformed, focusing in particular on the reconstitution of gender relations and women's rights to the city. GenUrb explores the economic, social, and environmental dimensions of gendered insecurity through the everyday placemaking practices of grassroots urban women. It also examines the role of policy shapers in the application of SDGs 5 and 11, and the New Urban Agenda. GenUrb engages in public education and knowledge mobilization activities, including workshops, radio and television programs, cultural/artistic exhibitions, documentaries, and plays.
